## NSWSPC POLICY ADOPTED 27/8/2004

## THE ENROLMENT OF STUDENTS IN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

- 1. The SPC should develop protocols and processes for principals to use in:
  - a. school promotion activities which might affect enrolments in other government schools; and
  - b. transfer of students between secondary schools during secondary school years.
- 2. The SPC should demand information from the DET about, and undertake additional research into the impact on enrolments of:
  - a. the extent to which curriculum is disengaging and alienating;
  - b. special designation schools on neighbouring schools;
  - c. full-fee paying overseas students;
  - d. the proximity and practices of publicly-funded private schools
  - e. damaging events in or linked to particular schools;
  - f. gifted and talented classes in local schools;
  - g. flagship type programs in schools.
- 3. The SPC should actively support:
  - a. the customer service and school promotion material prepared by DET;
  - b. school promotional support which is targeted and local rather than systems-based;
  - c. sufficient flexibility in staffing to support key school programs which contribute to the culture, identity and success of a school
- 4. The SPC should discuss at appropriate conferences matters which impact on the enrolments of government secondary schools, including: the operation of private schools, the structure of government secondary schools, competition between schools, school promotion and other related matters.
- 5. The SPC should actively participate in the proposed DET working party on promotion of schools and promote the ideas and proven successful strategies in the promotion of government schools.
